# **Preserve Tis Hazari clash** footage: Court to police

A Delhi court has directed Delhi Police to preserve the CCTV footage of the clashes between the police and the lawyers at Tis Hazari court premises that occurred on November 2

In his order on Tuesday, Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (ACMM) Jitendra Singh also directed police to file a compliance report stating the action taken by them in connection with the First Information Reports (FIRs) registered after the clashes.

The order comes after an application was filed by Delhi Bar Association in which they had also sought the preservation of the CCTV footage. In its application the association also asked about the status report on the FIRs and issuance of directions for the arrest of the accused persons.

In order the court stated that the investigating agency is



required to preserve all the relevant CCTV footages available in and around the place of inci-

"They are a crucial piece of evidence which can aid in verifying the allegations and counter-allegations of advocates and police," the court observed.

Delhi Bar Association (DBA) President N C Gupta alleged that the probe in not going on in a fair and proper way while Delhi Police had denied the claims of the petitioner and stated that a fair probe is taking place and efforts are also being made to expedite the same.

On November 2 at the Tis

parking dispute between an onduty policeman and a lawyer erupted, at least 20 security personnel and several advocates were injured. The protests triggered more on November 4 when a police constable was attacked by a group of lawyers outside Saket District Court.

Ordering a judicial inquiry by one of its retired judges into the clash, the Delhi High court at a special sitting on November 3 suspended a police official and transferred two senior police officials during pendency of the investigations

The Delhi High Court also directed the Delhi Police commissioner to transfer Special Commissioner Sanjay Singh and Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), Harendra Singh during pendency of the investigation. It had also asked not to take coercive action against the lawyers for the FIRs filed in the Tis Hazari court

### Man kills girlfriend on his birthday in N Delhi hotel room

A33-year-old woman was killed by her friend after a quarrel broke out between them over a petty issue. The incident occurred on Monday night at an OYO flagship hotel in Outer North Delhi's Alipur area. Police said the victim, a resident of Khera Kalan, had checked into the hotel with accused on Monday to celebrate his birth-

Police said the accused identified as Vikki Mann, a resident of Alipur has been arrested. According to Gaurav Sharma, the Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), Outer North Delhi, on Tuesday around 10.30 am a Police Control Room (PCR) call was received regarding a woman lying in unconscious condition in a hotel room at Delhi's Alipur area.

"Acting on the call, Emergency Response Vehicle (ERV) was dispatched to the

hospital where she was declared brought dead," said the DCP.

'During initial investigation, it was revealed that the room was booked in the name of deceased identified as Asha (name changed), a resident of Khera Kalan in Delhi and accused Vikki. As per hotel record both checked in on Monday to celebrate accused birthday," said the DCP.

"During celebration, a quarrel took place between them while they were consuming and in course of quarrel, Vikki hit on woman's throat with some hard object and she became unconscious. However, the accused fled away from the spot leaving the woman inside the room," said the DCP.

"A case under relevant sections of Indian Penal Code (IPC) was registered at Alipur police station and the accused has been arrested," said the DCP adding that further investigation is going on.

# Inter-State gunrunner gang busted, two held

With the arrest of two men, the Delhi Police on Tuesday claimed to have busted a gang of inter-State guns suppliers active in Delhi and its peripherals. Police said they have also recovered four country-made pistols along with 10 cartridges and a scooty, used in delivering the weapons, from the possession of the duo.

The accused have been identified as Sunil (35), a resident of South Delhi's Mehrauli area and Ankit Saini (28), a resident of Uttar Pradesh Aligarh area. Police said the duo used to buy weapons from Aligarh at cheap price and used to sell them in Delhi-NCR at a good price.

According to Atul Kumar Thakur, the Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), South Delhi, on November 11, specific inputs were received that an arms supplier would come near Chirag Delhi flyover, Masjid Mod to



deliver arms and ammunition. "Acting on the specific inputs, a trap was laid and the

police team managed to apprehend two persons carrying four country-made pistols and 10 cartridges. Later on, they were identified as Sunil and Ankit Saini. Subsequently, a case under section 25 of Arms Act w2as registered at CR Park police station," said the DCP.

"During interrogation, the accused Ankit Saini disclosed that he used to buy country made pistols from Aligarh at cheap price and further sell them in Delhi at good price through his accomplice Sunil to prospective buyers," said the DCP adding that interrogation and verification for source of supply in Aligarh and buyers in Delhi is in progress.

According to Sharat Kumar Sinha, the Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP), PCR, on the early hours of Tuesday, at around 1:36 AM a PCR call was received in which the caller told police that a boy around 5-6 year-old is sitting under a people tree in Gautam Nagar area.

"A police team on Multi Purpose Vehicle (MPV) reached the spot where the caller handed over child to the police. The police team started searching the parents nearby the locality of Gautam Nagar and surrounding area by announcing about the child on PA system," said the DCP.
